Fayette County Public Schools-- Trauma Informed/ Trauma Sensitive Schools Implementation Plan

While FCPS has provided training related to the topic trauma-informed care in education as well as trauma-informed interventions for student support professionals over the course of the past 6 years, we are working to be more intentional in our efforts to support each school (along with our district as a whole) in becoming a trauma-informed system. The following outlines the work we have done to date and our plan moving forward.

2016-2020	 FCPS has partnered with the UK Center for Trauma & Children to develop training modules for Tier 1 Trauma Informed practices. Student Support providers have received training in trauma-related interventions to promote healing for students. Professional learning has been provided for teachers around becoming trauma-informed, secondary traumatic stress, and developing trauma supports in the classroom. All new hires to the district receive an overview of the impact of trauma on students and the classroom.
August 2020	 All members of District Leadership received a 2-hour trauma informed practices training All FCPS staff received a 2.5 hour Canvas Course related to Trauma-Informed Care

Student Support teams are using the outcome of the above screening as part of their MTSS decision-making process. Ongoing coaching for the integration of the screener data into the MTSS process is being provided by the district Student Support Team
