

Dayton High School Board Report Wednesday, February 22nd, 2023



- Progress Report Period for 3rd Quarter ended on Monday, February 6th.
 - o Progress Reports for 3rd quarter were sent home on Wednesday, February 8th.
- Class Scheduling Update for 2023 2024 school year:
 - o Gathered request from staff during January on what classes they would like to teach next school year.
 - o All incoming 9th, 10th, 11th and 12th grade students had class scheduling meetings with Ms. Fields, Mr. Wolf, Dr. Wright, and Mr. Meyers.
 - We discussed credits, transcripts, GPAs, junior and senior year opportunities outside of DHS and sent home a scheduling form that students filled out reflecting the courses they want to take next year.
 - All high school students took an interest survey to see what courses they would like offered next year (original list to choose from came from teacher suggestions)

- Three junior students have begun their co-ops in logistics and also are continuing their Gateway Logistics courses online. Two of these students have been placed at DHL and one at Cengage.
- Eight students volunteered to take an Introduction to Computer Systems online course through Gateway helping them to become post-secondary ready
- Nine sophomores received their acceptance email from NKU, welcoming them into the YSA program for the 2023-2024 school year. Each student hit the benchmarks in Math, English and Reading on the ACT.
- John Hall from Gateway came in and discussed with juniors and seniors the River City Promise
- Arlinghaus Heating/ Cooling and Plumbing came in to discuss possible co-ops and post-secondary
 opportunities in the trades of HVAC and plumbing. The Arlinghaus rep presented to all life skills
 students and another large group including our ATC seniors.
- Our four ATC nursing students and a senior interested in nursing after high school, attended a Live Surgery at St. Elizabeth's Training Center.
- We will be meeting with a representative from the Enzweiler Building Institute this month to discuss a possible partnership for next year as another trades option.
- Mr. Collins has become the point person for the Upward Bounds Program for NKU. This collaboration gives our students an opportunity to live on NKU's campus for 4 weeks over the summer and travel to a different state to explore with all expenses paid.
- Five students attended the West Point Academy of Cincinnati Leadership & Ethics Seminar.
- Currently five students have applied for the 2023-24 Chamber of Commerce Regional Youth Leadership program.
