## BOARD REPORT Lincoln Elementary School February 2023

**The Reading League** – Our literacy work with *The Reading League* continues with our current work including:

- TEACHER COACHING Continued coaching by our coach, Jaime Burse. Jaime meets with teachers individually and virtually every 2-3 weeks. Our teachers are now submitting videos to Jaime through the platform, TORSH in order to receive feedback.
- BOOK STUDY 19 LES staff members, along with Mrs. Dragan and Mr. Wolf, are participating in a voluntary book study for the book *The Knowledge Gap*. Ms. Amanda Berringer is leading this rich experience for our staff members, which includes participation of reading the book and participating in six learning sessions.
- ON-GOING LEARNING ALL LES staff will be participating in virtual trainings on our early-release dates 2/23 and 3/1 over these topics:
  - o Building Oral Language Development to Boost Comprehension and Composition
  - Reading and Spelling Multisyllabic Words

**Benchmark Assessments** – Our students completed their *Winter MAP* assessments in January. We are VERY pleased with the students' growth progress and will use this important winter data to enhance/make needed changes to our new WIN ("What I Need") groups that began on January 10<sup>th</sup>. These groups are created to meet students' academic needs. Each grade level's 7-10 WIN groups consist of groups for Gifted and Talented, on grade level and also intervention.

**Gifted Book Fair** - The Scripps Howard Foundation gifted Scholastic Book Fair was a HUGE success. EACH student in grades preschool through 6<sup>th</sup> grade received FIVE student selected books and a free water bottle. The second book fair will be gifted to our students in April. A BIG thanks to Megan Blosser, Connie Levy and Board member, Diane Huff for making the book fair such a wonderful experience for our students.

**Camp Joy** – We are currently in the middle of a Camp Joy campaign to celebrate the 20<sup>th</sup> anniversary of this overnight 5<sup>th</sup> grade trip. Our goal is to raise enough money to send every fifth grader to Camp Joy free of charge. So far we are at 53% of reaching our goal!

## Enrichment at Lincoln -

- Field Trips -- Our students are all continuing to get opportunities to learn outside of the classroom by participating in: intentionally planned grade level field trips; club field trips (Club Unify and Chess Club); and Arts enriched field trips; gifted and talented field trips; etc.
- Clubs All of our afterschool clubs continue at Lincoln with 3-4 clubs happening every day after school
- 21<sup>st</sup> Century Our 21<sup>st</sup> Century program continues to serve 71 students daily after school Monday Thursday! We are awaiting word on if we will receive our recently submitted expansion grant.
