### 1. 2022-23 SY Parent Survey Window is Open.

Newport Independent Schools and the Kentucky Department of Education (KDE) values parent's input and wants to learn more about their experience as a parent/guardian of a child with an Individual Education Program (IEP). Each year KDE requires districts to inform parents about the opportunity to participate in the survey. All district must meet state survey participation rate set by KDE (25% +). Results of the parent survey will be analyzed and used to improve student programming and supports, on-going communication with parents and family engagement opportunities. Newport Independent Schools has begun the process of notifying parents that the parent survey window is open. Parent Survey window will close June 30, 2023. The online survey can be completed in four ways:

## 2. Preparing for Kentucky Alternate Assessment Program

Test Window 2 officially opens on April 17, 2023. The Kentucky Alternate Summative Assessment is aligned with the Kentucky Academic Standards. The Kentucky Alternate Assessment was developed in 1990 as a result of the Reform Act of 1990 to provide schools and programs with a valid and reliable means of assessing the instruction provided to students with moderate and significant disabilities (i.e., for the less than 1% of the total student population for whom traditional assessments would be an inappropriate measure of progress). This year Newport has 14 students participating in the alternate assessment program. Student performance levels are rated the same as peers (Novice, Apprentice, Proficient, and Distinguished). Student assessment results are reported in the fall of the following school year.
