# **Smoky Mountain Cup Tournament**

#### Date:

September 8-10, 2023 Friday - Sunday

### Tournament Info:

The Tournament will be hosted in the Rocky Top Sports World in **Gatlinburg**, **Tennessee**, it is one of the country's newest indoor/outdoor sports tournament destinations. With state-of-the-art facilities and amenities. The girls will have the opportunity to play on 5 full synthetic turf fields and 1 natural grass field. We will play at least three games, with teams all over both Tennessee and Kentucky. These games can give us experience to bring back to our own Regional Tournament and possibly give us the drive to go to state.



#### Costs:

Tournament Fee: \$450.00

Housing: \$2,280.00 (6 rooms, 2 nights @ \$190.00 a night)

Food: \$878.00

Activities: \$400.00 (optional)

Total: \$4,008.00

We currently have **\$3,300.00** in our account. Below I have listed our upcoming fundraisers to cover the extra cost.

June 3rd:

**Fall Sports Yard Sale**. This is a fundraiser I'm organizing for all of the fall sports. We will be selling donated items, clothes from the players' spring cleaning, and anything else the players may have. All proceeds go towards the team who is selling the item. **The projected profit from this fundraiser is \$400-\$800**.

June 24th:

**Car Wash**. This will be our second year with this fundraiser. Last year we had a profit of \$2,100. **We are anticipating a profit anywhere between** \$1,500-\$2,000.

July 29th:

**Juggle - a - thon**. Juggling in soccer is the ability to keep the ball in the air for as long as possible with your feet, knees, and head. Each time you touch the ball will be counted as one juggle. Just like a walk-a-thon where you would donate \$.5-\$5 per mile walked, you donate an amount for each juggle. **The profit could range anywhere \$300-\$1,000**. Due to the unfamiliarity with this fundraiser, we're unsure of the profits.

If we make the lowest profit we're anticipating, we will make a total of **\$2,200**. This would put our account total to **\$5,500**.

If we make the highest anticipated profit, we will make a total of \$3,800. This would put our account total to \$7,100.

We suspect our profits will fall between these estimations. Either of these totals will be more than enough to cover the tournament cost of \$4,008.00.

# Transportation:

The tournament begins on a Friday and having enough bus drivers may be difficult, but the mode of transportation will be school bus. If most parents waive their right to transportation and a small amount of students do not have parents going to the tournament the school van will be utilized. Parents have expressed an interest in utilizing the transportation waiver as many of them will be attending to watch the girls compete.
