IV. Powell County High School Student Advisory Council Presentation

Discussion:

Mrs. Frazier presented the options to the Board in regards to an appraisal of all school facilities.

- Two Options: Use KDE rates or a Certified Appraisal for Insurance Coverage
- One certified appraisal firm could not complete an appraisal until May 1st which is too late.
- Houchens Insurance recommended someone who has experience at a lower price no more than (\$8k) -and that person can do the appraisal in the timeframe needed.

Options Are:

- 1. Use KDE Rates which would increase property by approximately 20M (including all buildings.)
- 2. Get a certified appraisal. The appraisal cost would be no more than \$8,000 and could bring significant savings.

Mrs. Frazier stated that it's up to the Board to decide which route to take the district for insurance coverage.

The Board discussed that an appraisal would let us know that we have properly insured our facilities.

Discussion:

The Council for Better Education is supporting all public school districts in Kentucky to keep HB9, a charter school bill, from becoming law. In Kentucky, it is against the Constitution to use public funds for private

schools. The Council for Better Education does not oppose private schools, but strongly opposes the use of public tax dollars or tax credits to be utilized to support private or charter schools. Several talking points are attached to bring light to the necessity of supporting the work of the CBE as they put HB9 to a legal test in the court.

The following resolution was adopted:

IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED that the Powell County Board of Education

authorizes Superintendent Wasson to take all necessary steps to support the Council for Better Education, Inc. ("CBE"), in its legal challenge to the unconstitutionality of House Bill 9, and the payment of any appropriate dues or assessments related to this school district's membership in CBE or its support of the referenced legal challenge.

Mrs. Wasson noted that there is a fee of \$1,949.27 for the district to pay to continue to be a member and support CBE.
