

Professional development will be offered at our Covington PD Academy on August 16 and 17 for any staff who chooses to attend or is assigned by the principal. The PD Academy is not a requirement from the district but can be by your supervisor. Staff can choose up to 12 hours of PD to reach their 24 hours. If staff choose to attend sessions that put them above their 24 hours, those stipends must be paid at the school level, or it will be counted as unpaid professional learning. (Sessions will be shared once planning is complete)

The district in all departments will provide stipends for all NEW teacher training.

If staff <u>choose</u> to attend additional professional development beyond their 24 hours, it will be counted as unpaid professional learning. Principals can decide to pay a stipend for this professional learning if they wish from their school funds.
