INSTRUCTIONAL COACHES REPORT (Ms. Winkler / Mr. Skaggs)

Ms. Winkler

- This month I have continued regular coaching meetings with each teacher along with co-teaching and collaborating to provide support. I have devoted a lot of time to our new teacher, Ms. Whelan, who is off to a great start!
- We have continued work with our essential standards during PLCs. We also met with Kim Snowball from NKCES to develop goals and next steps for the 23-24 SY.
- All students participated in MAP Testing. I assisted with that process. We have spent and will continue to spend time analyzing that data to inform instructional decisions and Tier 2 and Tier 3 placements for next school year.
- We have reviewed and identified ALEKS as our Tier 3 intervention tool and will be providing training and support for the teachers who will be using it.
- We met as a math department to discuss our math pathways. This is an ongoing discussion as we consider research-based best practice in conjunction with our unique school structure and schedule.

Mr. Skaggs

- The RTI Guiding Coalition rolled out the new schedule that includes protected times set-aside for tier 2 and tier 3 times. This is a small part of the massive overhaul the middle/high school is completing for a stronger MTSS.
- The instructional team was able to do some deep diving into MAP scores from the year. Noticings and wonderings were used to fuel conversations on personnel needed in FOCUS groups (tier 3) for the Fall 2023.
- Book Giveaway was held on May 17. All English classes brought their students to the library to participate in a free book fair. A plethora of books were available. We were able to give away popular books to nearly 250 students who took the opportunity to take a book.

GUIDANCE COUNSELOR REPORT (Mrs. McDougall)

- This month has been consumed with Kentucky Summative Assessment end of the year activities! I conducted the Administration Code Spring training, as well as the KSA proctor training. We tested May 5-12. We tested all students except for 1 and are currently working on bringing that student in to take the exams.
- We had the 8th graders from Southgate visit our school. It was a great visit and we believe almost all of the students are planning to enroll at BHS.
- I also have been meeting about Graduation, Undergrad Awards, Scholarships and class offerings for next year.

ASSISTANT PRINCIPAL REPORT (Ms. Young)

- **Behavior**
 - Upon reviewing our behavior reports for each month this semester, we have found that our number of behavior referrals have continued to decrease with February being our highest month with 46 of our students involved in a total of 69 behavioral infractions. This number decreased in March with 29 students involved in 36 infractions and April there were 29 students involved in 35 infractions. With only 11 days so far in May we have seen 11 students involved in 12 infractions. We are happy to see the continued decrease and hope that we can continue this trend as we begin next school year!
 - We will continue to grow in our knowledge of Restorative Discipline practices in order to promote the desire for our students to act respectfully and responsibly while increasing engagement in our classrooms.
- **Attendance**
 - With this school year coming to an end, we have focused our efforts on next year and increasing our student attendance. Through the summer months we will be meeting to revamp our current attendance practices in order to provide a more systematic approach in which we are able to sustain and address our student attendance concerns. This will include increased home visits in order to build relationships and connections with families earlier in the school year. We also believe the new focus on our MTSS system will help to address the needs of our students and therefore increase each student's desire to be present.
