

Choice Zone Schools

- Dual resides is an option available to students in the Choice Zone. Under this option, students have 2 choices - an elementary, middle, or high school close to home **OR** a corresponding elementary, middle, or high school outside of the Choice Zone
- Incoming kindergarten, 6th, and 9th grade students living in the Choice Zone **are required** to complete an application and rank school selections inside the Choice Zone or outside of the Choice Zone.
- All current Choice Zone students will remain at their school unless there has been a change of address. **There will not be a default selection.**

School Choice Important Highlights

- The new boundaries are in effect for the incoming K, 6, and
 9.
- Students will remain at their previous schools unless there was a change of address after August 10, 2022. All efforts were made to provide for consistency in school enrollment for students with a change of address where possible.
- Transfer applications will be prioritized instead of processed solely by timestamp to support requests for siblings separated by boundary changes. Child care and start time change requests will receive priority as well.
 4,223 student transfer applications have been submitted as of June 16, 2023.
- All Choice Zone elementary students were granted 1st or 2nd choice in their elementary zone applications.
- Increase in kindergarten applications for the 2023-24 school year.



Magnet Strategy Moving the work forward

- The middle school MST/STEM/STEAM schools (Farnsley, Meyzeek, Newburg, Olmsted South, and Grace James), Western High School, and the district magnet committee attended the 2023 Magnet Schools of America Conference. Attendees were able to participate in valuable school tours and sessions to assist our district as we move forward to better align with MSA national standards and best practices.
- The Magnet Schools Assistance Program grant application has been submitted for Coleridge-Taylor Montessori and Western High School (STEM) to support their redesign process.
- Magnet schools will begin setting Diversity Targets and Goals in July. This work will support our efforts to ensure magnet school populations mirror district demographics and that students have equitable access to magnet schools and programs.
