

Total MLs by Year in JCPS





Opt-In

MLs receive English language instruction through the ESL teacher and are required to take ACCESS for ELLs test.

ESL Program

A program in which specially trained teachers utilize strategies and methodologies to instruct Multingual Learners in attaining proficiency in English and developing high levels of academic achievement.


