HISTORY/BACKGROUND:

The FFVP is a federally assisted program providing free fresh fruits and vegetables to children at eligible elementary schools during the school day. The goal of the FVP is to introduce children to fresh fruits and vegetables, to include new and different varieties, and to increase overall acceptance and consumption of fresh, unprocessed produce among children. The FFVP also encourages healthier school environments by promoting nutrition education. The district was awarded \$245,891 with \$62,098 allocated to River Ridge, \$43,127 allocated to Beechgrove, \$41,053 allocated to White's Tower, \$35,746 allocated to Caywood, \$32,574 allocated to Taylor Mill, and \$31,293 allocated to Ft. Wright.
