Fleming County Schools, through the work associated with the L3 Coalition will:

- Develop a Local Accountability System that is transparent, embedded into the district's continuous improvement process, and aligned to the goals of the L3 Coalition.
- Develop a Local Accountability System that can be replicated across the Commonwealth, using minimal financial resources which will allow all districts to adopt and operationalize seamlessly.
- Identify strategic partners within the Commonwealth that can help align Local Accountability Systems to research-based areas that are important to local communities.
- Provide transparent access to other L3 school districts with a focus on lessons learned, strategies utilized, and other resources.

Kentucky currently has two districts with *fully operational* Local Accountability Systems.



Some Truths



Local Accountability *is not*.

- Anti-testing. Most local accountability systems include some form of student testing in the accountability formula. Local accountability is about <u>better</u>, formative, and authentic student <u>data!</u>
- Designed to lower expectations. In fact, when effective, there are higher expectations for local school districts.

Local Accountability is:

- Holding local district and school leaders, teachers, staff, parents, guardians, and the community accountable for creating the best learning environments, experiences, opportunities, outcomes, and supports for students.
- Utilizing formative and summative data to transform processes, systems, and supports in real-time and to make continuous improvements to enhance learning environments and student outcomes.

Measures of Quality: Version 1.0

The Measures of Quality for Operations and Support Systems focus on the operations that are often not seen by the general public; however, are mission-critical. Operations and Support Systems include technology, maintenance and facilities, finance, food and nutrition, and transportation. To determine if the district's efficiency with operations is meeting distinctive levels, a variety of data, such as bus ridership, cleanliness of classrooms, etc. is examined along with random stakeholder surveys about the operations and support systems in the district each month.


