Purpose

The primary focus for the Wildcat Academy Summit is to develop Collective Teacher Efficacy through professional development opportunities.

Improving teacher efficacy is paramount to increasing student success quickly. John Hatties' research states the following concerning collective teacher efficacy: "Collective Teacher Efficacy is the collective belief of teachers in their ability to positively affect students. With an effect size of d=1.57 Collective Teacher Efficacy is strongly correlated with student achievement." In Hattie's research, Collective Teacher Efficacy has the highest effect size concerning impact on student achievement. When reached it has an impact of 1.57 years of growth for the learner.

- 99% teacher participation (100% Instructional Assistant participation, who were not required to attend)
- Building Partnerships that will promote continued professional learning for staff.
- Kick-off of BELT (Building Equity Leadership Team) with 2 day training with Dr. Mahmood

SESSION 4: ADDRESSING CULTURAL BEHAVIORS IN OUR CLASSROOMS

In this session, participants are introduced to how culture can influence the way that teachers view behaviors in the classroom.

- Add a speaker to open event





Job Assignment Location 67 responses






How would you rate the relevance of the session content? 67 responses




How would you rate the quality of the session content? 67 responses




How would you rate the quality of the venue/location (NHS)? 66 responses



How would you rate the number of sessions offered each day? 67 responses




How would you rate the length of time for each session? 67 responses
