Background

KDE's OSEEL is taking extraordinary steps to support local districts in providing services that assist teachers and students with opportunities that promote students in achieving their goals. The goal of the American Rescue Plan, Early Learning Team (ARP-EL) is to enhance efforts at identifying students in Preschool through 2nd grade who experience the greatest loss of instruction due to the COVID-19 pandemic. The delivery and measurement of evidenced-based, high leveraged teacher practices will result in opportunity and gap closures; thus, reducing the number of students inappropriately identified for special education by the third grade. It will also improve the equity and opportunity for all exceptional learners, including gifted and talented

programming, for underserved populations. These strategies will also be implemented to improve the instruction and support students receive while learning from home.

Application Details

The COVID-19 pandemic disproportionately affected early learners (Preschool to 2nd grade) in comparison to other age groups. The requests made by each participant must align with KDE's interest in improving educational outcomes within the classroom and the topics of discussion during the Teacher Leader Community meetings.

The purpose of this application will be to ensure high-quality, age-appropriate services for public preschool programs that allow effective teaching and learning in collaboration with the ARP Early Learning Team. The grant will focus on high-leverage/ evidence-based strategies, tools and processes that support highly qualified preschool programs that can close the gaps within their programs caused by the COVID-19 pandemic. <u>Instructional Resources - Kentucky Department of Education</u>

Funding

Each Teacher Leader Community participant may apply for funds equaling \$1,000 for their district's preschool program, for an allowable amount of up to \$1,000 per Year 2 TLC participant. Funds must be used to meet the goals as outlined by the ARP Early Learning Team.

Grant Application Procedures and Requirements

The ARP Early Learning Team promotes improvements in teaching and learning that will directly improve the educational success of preschool programs affected by Covid-19. Teacher Leader Community participants seeking support may apply for ARP funds in implementing high-leverage strategies, evidence-based interventions, professional development, or programs that will impact student learning affected by Covid-19. Areas to consider for grant proposals include the following: literacy, math, social/emotional learning, teacher's well-being, challenging behaviors, kindergarten readiness, professional learning communities and/or family and community involvement. Submissions will be evaluated based on a provided scoring rubric.

District/Teacher Roles and Responsibilities

- 1. Program Structure and Personnel
 - Grantees will maintain the following roles and responsibilities:
 - o Interpret strengths and needs of district preschool program;
 - Provide pre- and post-data demonstrating the underlying concern to be addressed with the intervention;
 - Work collaboratively with the defined district team to ensure student needs are met. (District Team – Building Administrator, Teacher, and Central Office Administrator)

2. Student Focused Planning

- Assessment data is used to specify the needs of the students within a classroom or school;
- Accommodations for students are provided as needed;
- Ongoing student data collection to monitor growth; and
- High-leverage/evidence-based strategies and/or programs that help students close specified gaps.

3. Grantee Accountability

- Participate in independent evaluations identified by KDE.
- Provide information and data to the evaluation team. The evaluation will be based on:
 - o Evidence of student outcomes
 - Assurance that students receiving special education services have equal opportunities and access.
 - o Evidence of community and/or family engagement
 - o Evidence of professional development when funded by the grant.
