

- Pearson provided 6 staff members to work closely with students and teachers to provide SEL lessons for all students as well as reading and math interventions for identified students.
- Trained the 6 staff members on reading and math interventions
- Resources provided included Targeted Reading Intervention, Whole Number Foundations, Pirate Math, AimsWeb+, and SSIS SEL

Enrichment Days


- 2022 had 133 students enrolled & participating with 225 recovered credits with needs to recover 4, 5, 6+ credits per student as an average

Why do we need a "Portrait" of our learners?


- Creates a collective vision of student success for the entire school community.

- Provides a foundational tool that should shape all school design work.









Diversity, Equity, Inclusion & Belonging Focus for 23-24

I found that the HIVEs with the student group were very enlightening so this should definitely continue and possibly be expanded to include more students. We also need to have a continued emphasis on the diversity that we have at our school this could be achieved through visuals, HIVE sessions, Channel 4, social media, inclusive moments at special events, etc. I feel that hearing stories from students about their challenges and traditions goes a long way in developing awareness, empathy, and respect.

Make sure Equity is discussed with staff at least once a month with bits of the modules sprinkled in for reminders- keep it in the forefront of teachers minds

continue to focus on transparent communication/meaningful inclusion within curriculum/hold all stakeholders accountable for communication, etc.

-Cultural fairs / nights for everyone, not just the culture of focus for that event

-Family nights focusing on our SEL curriculum or at least a better job of sending home information about the focus each unit (week, month, whatever)

Meeting consistently to increase awareness of diverse populations in the school and incorporating practices to allow teachers the opportunity to become more knowledgeable about DEI practices.

I would like to see our team meet with students to get their feedback, as they are the eyes and ears of whst is going on.



PLC Right

- Creating Valid and Reliable Common Assessments
- Organizing Data Analyzing Student Results from Common Formative Assessments
- What supports/interventions are needed to provide struggling students additional time and support? How will we extend learning for students who have mastered the standard(s)?



Other Supporting Actions determined by School Teams:

- **Standards-Based Grading** in grades 3rd-5th to measure and report mastery of standards over the course of the year.
- Different assessment platform at WCMS to support the creation of common assessments as well as the measurement of standards mastery.
