- **Ignite Passion & Experience Excellence.** How will you as a school or district leader ensure this happens for the people you lead, communicate, and connect with in our community?
- WE CAN, IF... Mentality. It takes each of us working together for EACH student. No one person can single-handedly move Oldham County Schools forward. We must stay positive and focused to support each other, our schools, and departments while working together as a TEAM. We will continue to build on the smart and productive work that we have done in the last two years.
