I have been informed that there is a movement to have the Bullitt Central Auditorium named in memory of Barbara Elliott. Ms. Elliott was the Speech and Debate Coach while I attended Bullitt Central High School from 1974-1977. While participating in her Speech and Debate Program I was taught skills such as research, logic, and communication. These are skills that I used daily in my career as an attorney and use now as the Circuit Court Judge. Ms. Elliott taught me how to speak and address large numbers of jurors and how to address smaller crowds while in trial.

While working on Speech and Debate activities we traveled with Ms. Elliott to schools and universities throughout the country. We traveled for debate tournaments in such places as Seattle, Chicago, Boston, Atlanta, and Washington D.C. Ms. Elliott was a well-respected coach in those tournaments and brought great recognition to Bullitt County Schools. As her students we received success and recognition on the local and regional level in this state as well as national recognition and accomplishments at national tournaments.

In addition, Ms. Elliott served as the faculty sponsor for various drama productions at Bullitt Central. During my career at Bullitt Central I participated in productions of Fiddler on the Roof, My Fair Lady, and Westside Story. All under the direction of Ms. Elliott. In these productions we learned various organizational skills and communication skills that remain important in my daily life.

Ms. Elliott went way beyond what was required in her position as a teacher with the Bullitt County Public Schools. She was always working extra hours to enhance our knowledge of speech, debate, and drama. She also took extra time on weekends for us to attend speech and debate tournaments. Page Two (2)

I continue to maintain contact with other students who participated in these activities. Ms. Elliot taught us communication skills which are essential in our daily lives. Many times, when speaking in court I reflect on her teachings. Other attorneys, teachers and business owners have her to thank for their ability to organize, speak persuasively in public.

In addition to her extracurricular activities as the speech and debate coach, I had Ms. Elliott as a teacher. I had her for various classes and learned a great deal about the classic novels, theatre, and cinema in her courses. This helped me to prepare for college and provided a cultural enrichment and enlightenment which I continue enjoy today. I highly encourage you to consider naming the Auditorium in her honor as she has brought great enrichment to her students and significant recognition to the school district.
