

Staff members have moved into the upstairs classrooms at MCHS.




Facilities Updates - Marion County High School

The Farm-to-School Cookout day was October 27 throughout MCPS.






MCHS hosted a Trick-or-Treat event for MSD students from across the district. Students and staff handed out candy and many were in costume as well.
