I recommend approval of this request.



VI. Old Business

A. Dress Code Expectations

- Teacher thoughts: Hoods on sweatshirts must remain on the prohibited list as it is a safety issue to have people obscuring their identities. The purpose of the dress code, to prepare students for the professional world, seems to be misunderstood or unknown for the majority of students. Specific issues are addressed, but there are several teachers who do not fully enforce the dress code; however, several students are spoken to and then immediately remove whatever solution was given to them.
- This conversation will be continued at the next meeting. Verbiage and language may need to be updated and examined.

- Student Feedback
 - 76 students returned the school-wide form and 12 of the 15 students on the Principal's Advisory board returned the survey asking for feedback about the dress code. The predominant issues that students mentioned was an inconsistency and unfairness to the enforcement of the dress code. They mentioned that pajama pants and hats should not be banned in the dress code.

VII. New Business

A. Fine Arts Center Naming

Andrew Hobbs was present for the vote. The proposal is to name the new auditorium the "Judy Chandler Fine Arts Center" after several hundred former students have shown their support
