## Special Education December 1 Child Count 2023

We have returned to our pre-covid numbers. The total number of Special Education Students as of December 1, 2023 is $\mathbf{1 1 0 1}$ which is $16.1 \%$ of our student population. The table below shows the December 1 Child Count trend over the last 5 years.

Speech/Language Impairment, Specific Learning Disability, and Other Health Impairment continue to be our 3 largest groups with Autism continuing to rise each year over the past 7 years. The table below shows a breakdown of the different eligibility areas as of this year.
