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Description of the School

John Hardin High School is one of five high schools serving the students of Hardin County and is located between the towns of Elizabethtown and Radcliff, KY. With a diverse population of appx. 820 students, John Hardin students come from both rural and urban backgrounds. There are appx. 53% of students receiving free or reduced meals and 13% of our students have a disability. The military greatly influences our student population, as many families we serve are active or retired military or support personnel at the military installation on Fort Knox. This presents challenges associated with a transient population. Also, the county is also expected to see a growth of 4,000 families due to a new factory opening in the county by 2026, so we are seeing new students move into the area and enroll in JHHS. Currently, we have 44% minority population made up of African American (17%), Hispanic (12%), Asian (2%), Pacific Islander (1%), and Two or More Races (12%). The John Hardin faculty is comprised of 55 certified teachers, 4 administrators, and 2 counselors.

The stakeholders for JHHS include the students, their parents/guardians, JHHS faculty and staff, health professionals, social service workers, local law enforcement, local business owners, and neighbors. Several times a year, the students and their parents/guardians are able to fill out different surveys to voice their praise and/or concerns for the school. Also, JHHS is able to survey our faculty and staff for reflections and new ideas. We also offer several nights a year when families are able to volunteer or partner with staff members for events. Some of these are educational opportunities for parents to learn how to better support their child. In addition to surveys and various volunteer opportunities, the School-based Decision Making Council is comprised of teachers, guardians, and administrators to make decisions within the school.

Outside of connected family members, JHHS participates in several community meetings each month-- Chamber of Commerce, Lion Club, Rotary, etc. We also attend meetings about the growing community and how to meet the needs of our community alongside leadership from other high schools, school districts, colleges, and industry.

The mission of John Hardin High School is to educate students, in cooperation with families and the community, to have the knowledge, skills, and attitude necessary to achieve their potential as socially responsible, life-long learners in a diverse and changing society. Our school motto, "Family, Respect, Success" has been adopted by the entire student body as well as the faculty and staff. The strength of our faculty ensures that content is taught to all students with rigor and relevance. Our students' determination to succeed allows them to rise to the challenges set forth by the faculty. The success of our students generates a sense of pride that they take with them into the community and beyond where they become productive members of society. We do all of this by taking care of each other as a family.

Two years ago, we also added a motto to be "Above the Line," meaning to excel in whatever we do. Both our students and staff have really bought into this. For example, you can hear students in the hallway tell each other to be above the line by picking up a candy wrapper off the floor or getting to class early. This phrase simply means to do whatever you do better than average and with a positive attitude.

Notable Achievements and Areas of Improvement

John Hardin continues to make strides in both academics and extra curricular activities. The previous five years of standardized assessment and school accountability, the school scored at the Distinguished level and was also a high performing school. Last school year (22-23), we earned a 100% in Transition Readiness of students who graduated from JHHS. We continue to see growth in CERT and I-Ready numbers leading to ACT score improvement post-pandemic. Recently, it was just announced that we earned the top spot of high schools in our district from the U.S. News and World Report's Top High Schools and we are also ranked in the top 30% of all high schools in the state of Kentucky. Last year, we had five students accepted into the Gatton Academy and two students selected for the Craft Academy. Both of these accomplishments provide enriching experiences that challenge our top students academically.

Our students continually win awards at the local, state, and national level in areas such as DECA, BETA, FCCLA, FFA, JROTC, Vex Robotics, Governor's Scholar Program, and Governor's School for the Arts. John Hardin has also achieved awards at the local, regional, and state level in several athletic events.

During the 2022-2023 school year, we also started the JHHS Athletic Hall of Fame to celebrate accomplishments and strengthen alumni ties.
