Discussion:

Laura Boyd shared her concerns to the Board.

Dr Stacy shared a statement that the Board of Education does not manage school discipline and student discipline issues cannot be addressed publicly:

Dr. Stacy's statement is as follows:

I understand that people are upset about a discipline issue and in 2023, I completely understand your fears, but I need to make a couple of things clear. Last Monday morning the high school administration was made aware of a potential threat on social media. The school premise was immediately secured and Ft. Mitchell Police was contacted. An investigation was conducted and determined that there was no direct threat nor an imminent or immediate safety risk. This resulted in no further action by the police department. In my opinion, communication should have gone at that time, but we chose not to do so since the police did not find the post to be a valid threat or anyone being in imminent danger. I was personally notified later in the evening and requested a statement go out regardless of the fact that there were no charges or immediate threat. However, once law enforcement didn't bring charges, the matter moved to a school discipline issue. Unlike a bomb threat or a student bringing a weapon to school, this situation was extremely vague and regardless many of the details that have been shared since have been fabricated. At no time were any of the students in the building in danger. At no time was the student in question unaccompanied once admin was made aware

Discipline issues cannot be discussed publicly. However, social media posts in the community have made it more difficult to conduct school discipline. We are absolutely not influenced by social media but it is problematic to defend our discipline process when it can easily appear that consequences are tied to social media posts and community demands that aren't even based on facts. I know people think we didn't have all the facts and I will respond with... refer to the "student discipline issues cannot be discussed publicly" so I cannot even combat those half-truths with response in writing or on social media.

Finally, one other thing that has been shared to make sure it's all clear, is that the Board does not manage school discipline. They have no "say" in school discipline other than to pass the handbook policies. They have no day-to-day interaction with those outcomes. That all falls back to the school admin.

Korey Yelton shared concerns regarding a potential threat by a student and the way the situation was handled by the administration. Chris Yelton shared concerns regarding the communication around a potential threat last week. Robyn Crouch asked for transparency around a student's potential threat. She asked questions around the consequences and steps moving forward with the student. Jennifer Withrow advocated for mental health support and curriculum for students and to have a no-tolerance policy in regard to threats.
