Holiday assistance programs will be offered to 100% of TCMS, TCHA and TCCHS students and their families in need as measured by FRYSC daily logs and holiday assistance forms, logs and referrals.</p> <p>3. Emergency services for assistance will be in place for 100% of students and families in need through the YSC.</p>	<p>A. YSC will provide students with basic need services to keep them prepared for their day at school. This may include school supplies, personal supplies, hygiene supplies, clothing, food and more.</p> <p>B. YSC will help provide students and their families in need with food during the holidays through the use of local food banks and donations of food gift cards or food baskets from community partners.</p> <p>C. YSC will plan, organize and coordinate the Christmas Angel Tree project to serve low income students and families.
