II. District Goals/Focus for the Year - Sarah Schobel

II.A. Beechwood Way

Discussion: We have been observing the "Beechwood Way" for the last 8 years.

Discussion:

This is the 2023-2024 school year "theme" that was decided as a District.

II.C. Comprehensive District Improvement Plan (CDIP)

The CDIP is the improvement plan for the District. We feel our plan goes over and above what the State requires. Areas of strength (surpassing 3-year goal) are elementary science, middle grades reading and math and high school writing. We are "on track" with elementary social studies, middle grades social studies and writing and high school reading, math and ACT. Areas of growth are elementary reading and math, middle grades science and high school science and social studies. Other areas to note on the Plan are the English learners, quality of school climate and safety, graduation rate of 100%, postsecondary readiness 98.8%, blue ratings and EDGE program.

II.D. Blueprint for Excellence - 5 District Goals

The current strategic plan ends this school year. We will be working on our next 3-year strategic plan this summer. The cohorts that align with our goals allow teachers to have leadership and decision making roles in the next strategic plan.

III. Comprehensive School Improvement Plans (CSIPs)

III.A. Elementary - Zach Ashley

Discussion:

The elementary CSIP was presented by Elementary Assistant principal, Alicia Wittmer.

Their highlights include:

- 83.7 KSA Blue (highest) Rating
- Avg. 25 percentage points higher than state average in most grade/subject tested for P/D
- Science 69% (BES)- 35%(State)
- Writing 78% (BES) 39% (State)
- 5th Math 77% (BES) 41% (State)
- 82% Kindergarten Ready (State Avg 43%)

The areas for growth:

- 3rd Grade Reading/Math P/D on KSA 48% to 60%+
- F/R Lunch GAP Group Proficiency on KSA
- 4th Grade Dip in P/D Reading and Math

Other areas that elementary is working on:

- New Math program (Envision) & ELA (english language arts) Program in 2024
- Common Assessment Process/Protocol
- RtI Data in Reading and Math Fall-Spring Growth

III.B. High School - Alan Yanke

The high school's highlights:

- Graduation Rate 99.1% from 94.5%
- AP Pass rate (3+) 67.20% from 45.6%
- ACT mean Composite Score 22.88 from 22.5
- Subscore increase in English, Math, Science
- Increase in KSA areas of 7th/10th Reading, 8th & 10th Math, 11th Writing

Areas of improvement:

- ACT Reading drop 23.1 to 22.5
- Increased use of CERT/Albert IO ACT questions embedded in the daily classroom + ACT after school sessions
- AP: AB/BC and Physics
- AP Action Plans and review, PLC's, meeting with other schools teaching the same classes, AP Saturday and after school sessions
- KSA Science 7th & 11th

 - Actions taken by a school within the SBDM approved code are school based decisions/actions
- If any event would rise beyond the level of the code references involving law enforcement, board attorney, and central office staff in more extreme cases.
