# Desired Timeline

## December 2023

# New A8 School

- Based upon feedback from stakeholders, we recommend creating a new A8 school with its own state ID number. This will allow for consistent enrollment and tracking of student progress through Infinite Campus and Edgenuity.
- Student enrollment will be specific to the new school to ensure proper record of entry/exit from the program.
- Middle school course catalog will be consistent for students and congruent to state requirements for middle school, including all state testing.
- High school course catalog will be consistent for students and congruent to state requirements for high school graduation, including all state testing and civics exam.

# Edgenuity Platform

- All students will use Edgenuity as learning platform. Students schedules will be individualized based upon their Individual Learning Plans (ILPs).
- Core classes will be set in accordance with state guidelines for middle/high school. Elective classes will be chosen from a list of available options with the Edgenuity package based on new contract.
- Full ADA funding will be provided for students who pass all classes. Classes are set as “performance-based” classes rather than “attendance-based.”
- Student schedules will be completely flexible, as the courses are asynchronous. Edgenuity provides easily accessible reports for parents and advisors on student progress, session logs, etc.

# Extra-Curricular & Co-Curriculars

- Students who participate in the virtual learning opportunity are agreeing to 100% online education. Therefore, students will not participate in co-curricular activities like CAPAA, Arvin, Band, or Choir.
- With a student's enrollment set in Infinite Campus as primarily with the virtual school, students will not participate in extracurricular activities through a traditional school program.
- With the OC Arts Center being open to the community, students participating in the virtual school are eligible to participate in afterschool activities at the Arts Center.

# Application Process & Monitoring

- Students/families will apply for entry into the virtual school. The application process will provide information regarding a student and a family's preparedness for online learning.
  - Specific needs - IEP, 504, GT, EL
  - Necessary resources
  - Code of conduct / expectations
  - Current academic standing
- Once enrolled, specific checkpoints and monitoring will be conducted by the student's advisor. If a student is not meeting benchmarks, they will be required to return to in-person learning at a traditional school or can withdraw back to homeschool. This will also be addressed in the student code of conduct and signed off on by parent(s) and student.
