

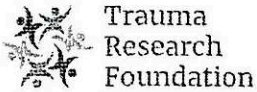

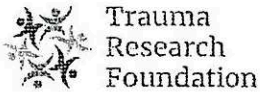

EDUCATIONAL OBJECTIVE/ CURRICULUM CONNECTIONS:	<p>HS.UH.KH.1 – Examine how Kentuckians influence and are influenced by major national developments in US History from 1877 – present.</p> <p>In our History of Kentucky class, SLO 6.2, called “The Price of Coal,” investigated the social, political, economic and cultural legacy of the coal industry for ordinary Kentuckians. Per student request, “Because this is such a touching topic in Kentucky history, we wanted to create a trip for our History of Kentucky students to explore a mine in Eastern Kentucky. This topic was one that many students in this course were interested in and are continuing their research through an additional semester assignment. Once again, our interest in this topic is the backbone for our trip. We want to give our peers an experience that will contribute to their previous research and that will be not only entertaining but will give them an opportunity to fully immerse themselves in the culture of Eastern Kentucky.”</p>

We also will be inviting seven students from AP Environmental Science course, as this content connects to their curriculum.

- Reflective Collaborator: We have collaborated with one another as well as the workers at the mines to gain a new perspective on this unique topic.
