The ACT was completed by the junior class on 3-12-24. They seem to be an overall good feeling about the test – hopefully we will know for sure in a couple of weeks.

Good things are going on in both buildings. We are now focusing on KSA the last fourteen days of school. Our prime window for instruction has been primarily uninterrupted, and we are looking for a good testing window.

The legislature is in session and will be in session until mid-April. As always there are several pieces of legislation flying along with numerous rumors. The biggest piece awaiting a budget. Not a lot of instructional legislation working at this point. SB 210, which would allow partial enrollment of a student is receiving notice – not favorable for schools.

The elementary school is still reviewing reading programs to comply with Senate bill 9. The current review is centering on CKLA. It is a pretty intense and rigorous platform, but it is reputedly believed to be effective.

In relation to Senate Bill 9, there is proposed legislation for this legislative session to link mathematics instruction to the reading bill.

With an eye on KSA, both buildings are preparing for the 24-25 school year. This is personnel reviews, curriculum and instruction reviews and professional development planning. A very busy time
