Me and My School (MMS) is a summer transition program for children entering kindergarten implemented by individual school districts and elementary schools. It is a four to six-week (54 hour) program where children attend class, preferably in the school they will attend in the fall. The purpose is to provide programming for children that focuses on preparing them in all aspects for entering school.



7. Unfortunately, we were not chosen as a recipient of the Preschool Partnership Grant this year. No district in Northern Kentucky was awarded the grant this time. All the awarded districts are located in South Central and Western Kentucky. This is a huge loss for our district, as well as the other districts in Northern Kentucky who previously received this grant.
