Overview: The Level 1 Training Program is a comprehensive, professional, continuing education training in which participants can develop an understanding of the conceptual basis of IFS and learn how to apply IFS techniques to various clinical populations.

Scope of Practice: Materials and methods included in this course may include interventions or practices that are beyond your scope of practice. As a professional in your given field, you are responsible for reviewing the scope of practice, including activities that are defined by applicable law as beyond the boundaries of your practice, and applying your learning in compliance with your professional standards.

Learning Objectives are listed on IFS Institute's website: Level 1 IFS Training Learning Objectives.

Format and Program Hours: The training includes lecture, discussion, demonstration, video review, experiential exercise, and small group practice. This training comprises three, 4-day sessions totaling 80 program hours (26.5 or 27 hours per session), plus two separate Bridge Days totaling 9.5 program hours (4.75 program hours per day).

This training has sessions that meet online only (live, real time) and sessions that meet on-site only (St. Charles, IL). Session dates and daily schedules are listed below.

Certificate of Completion and Attendance Requirements

Tuition and Fees

All amounts are in U.S. Dollars (USD).

Application Fee: The \$15 non-refundable, non-transferrable application fee is charged when you apply for the training.

Program Tuition: \$4,900

Tuition Deposit: The \$500 non-refundable, non-transferrable tuition deposit is due and charged at the time you are accepted into the training. It is required to hold your place in the training.

Tuition Balance: \$4,400 (\$4,900 Tuition - \$500 Tuition Deposit) due and charged on July 1, 2024.

This is a single, one-time payment. IFS Institute does not offer payment plans.

The tuition for hybrid trainings reflects additional costs associated with organizing and running these trainings. We encourage you to consider one of our fully online trainings if that option better suits your financial circumstances.

Late Payment: There is a \$20 fee for each late payment. If an amount due isn't paid in full within 7 calendar days of the due date IFS Institute reserves the right to withdraw a participant from the training.

Day 1: Fly overnight to Japan

Day 2: Tokyo

Later, stroll among the greenery and seawater ponds of Hamarikyu Gardens.

Day 7: Tokyo | Yamanashi

Hop on your group's private bus and travel to Yamanashi Prefecture, best known as the home of Mount Fuji. Start out at the Maglev Exhibition Center where, through a series of interactive exhibits, you'll see how superconducting magnetic technology will enable Japan's trains to become some of the fastest on the planet. You may even be able to view a test run of the Maglev train as it zooms past the Center. Next, prepare a traditional Korean meal during a cooking class before visiting the Bukchon Hanok Village.
