Consider/Approve the Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) with Murray State University to provide Dual Credit courses to qualifying KCSD students for the 2024-2025 school year.

APPLICABLE BOARD POLICY:

01.1 Legal Status of the Board

HISTORY/BACKGROUND:

Murray State University provides Dual Credit Courses to Dixie Heights, Simon Kenton, and Scott High School students. The primary purpose of a Dual Credit Program is to increase the educational options and opportunities for high school students and increase the overall quality of instruction and learning available through secondary schools. Dual Credit Programs allows students to earn credit at the secondary and postsecondary levels simultaneously. This MOU with Murray State University seeks to establish a framework that facilitates proper and effective implementation of Dual Credit Programs at the district and building levels.

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Murray State University Racer Academy Dual Credit Partnership Agreement Kenton County School District 2024 – 2025 Academic Year

- Status as Postsecondary Partner in the dual credit scholarship program
 - When a high school student enrolls in a Murray State University (MSU) dual credit course through Racer Academy, the high school enters into a partnership with the university.
- Costs involved in Racer Academy
 - o 2024 2025 tuition is \$93 per credit hour as of 4/1/2024. This cost could increase based on legislation. View updated rates at www.murraystate.edu/raceracademy. Billing questions should be directed to the Bursar's Office at (270) 809-4227 or msu.bursar@murraystate.edu.
 - Textbooks are not included in the tuition cost. The student is responsible for any materials needed for the course.

Security

- Admission requirements
 - Applicants must be high school juniors or seniors. Sophomores can take only agriculture (AGR) courses.
 - Applicants must have a minimum unweighted GPA of 3.0 or rank in the top half of their class.
 - o Applicants must submit the following:
 - Racer Academy Application for Admission on www.murraystate.edu/raceracademy.
 - High School Transcript.
 - Registration Request form.
 - ACT/SAT and/or KYOTE test scores for courses that have prerequisite requirements.
 - Student must be a resident of Kentucky and attend a Kentucky high school.
- Course delivery

There are multiple ways dual credit courses can be offered.

- o High school classroom with a high school instructor or Murray State instructor.
- o Online. A course may be combined with a college course or may be designated only for dual credit students.
- o Zoom
- o Murray Campus. Students may take a course with college students. Permission from the Dual Credit Coordinator, department chair, and instructor must be given

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prior to registering the student for the course. Sometimes, a specific course will be created for dual credit students only. Students who travel to campus must call the Parking Services with their vehicle information. Dual credits students are not charged for parking.

- Dates and Deadlines
 - Dates and deadlines for the semester will be posted on www.murraystate.edu/raceracademy.
- Important: Students who stop attending class (or who never attended a class in which they were enrolled) without withdrawing/dropping the class will earn a failing grade in that class. This failing grade will remain on their permanent college transcript and could keep them from receiving college scholarships.
- Distribution of grades:
 - Grades for MSU courses taught by teachers within the high school will be submitted to the high school and Murray State by the teachers.
 - Grades for MSU courses taught by MSU faculty/adjuncts will be distributed to the high school counselor listed on the Registration Request form.
 - o Agriculture grades will be distributed by David Black, dblack3@murraystate.edu
- Faculty Requirements:
 - o Instructors of record must have either:
 - a master's degree in the content area or
 - a master's degree in another area and a minimum of 18 graduate credit hours in the content area.
- FERPA regulations
 - Once a high school student begins taking college classes FERPA regulations apply to that student. Therefore, each student must give permission for MSU to share educational, financial, and behavioral information with high school officials. Academic Honesty

Murray State University takes seriously its moral and educational obligation to maintain high standards of academic honesty and ethical behavior. Instructors are expected to evaluate students' academic achievements accurately, as well as ascertain that work submitted by students is authentic and the result of their own efforts, and consistent with established academic standards. Students are obligated to respect and abide by the basic standards of personal and professional integrity.

Violations of Academic Honesty include:

- Cheating Intentionally using or attempting to use unauthorized information such
 as books, notes, study aids, or other electronic, online, or digital devices in any
 academic exercise; as well as unauthorized communication of information by any
 means to or from others during any academic exercise.
- Fabrication and Falsification Intentional alteration or invention of any information or citation in an academic exercise. Falsification involves changing information whereas fabrication involves inventing or counterfeiting information.
- Multiple Submission The submission of substantial portions of the same academic work, including oral reports, for credit more than once without authorization from the instructor.
- Plagiarism Intentionally or knowingly representing the words, ideas, creative
 work, or data of someone else as one's own in any academic exercise, without
 due and proper acknowledgment.

If the disciplinary action results in the awarding of a grade of *E* in the course, the student(s) may not drop the course.

Faculty reserve the right to invalidate any exercise or other evaluative measures if substantial evidence exists that the integrity of the exercise has been compromised. Faculty also reserve the right to document in the course syllabi further academic honesty policy elements related to the individual disciplines.

A student may appeal the decision of the faculty member with the department chair in writing within five working days. Note: If, at any point in this process, the student alleges that actions have taken place that may be in violation of the Murray State University Non-Discrimination Statement, this process must be suspended and the matter be directed to the Office of Institutional Diversity, Equity and Access. Any appeal will be forwarded to the appropriate university committee as determined by the Provost.
