This program is an intensive, weeklong program focused on developing creativity, teamwork, business, and leadership skills. From high school through college and into the business world, GSE empowers the dreams of Kentucky students who have the grit, drive, and passion to be Bluegrass entrepreneurs and create jobs here. Kentucky was one of the first states in the nation to create a Governor's School for Entrepreneurs. Since the first class of 49 high school students in 2013, the program has grown to more than 900 graduates, and now has high school and collegiate level programming. The Summer Startup Es have launched more than 30 businesses and filed multiple patents.

Each year, The Gatton Academy admits approximately 95 Kentucky sophomores, half of the selection male and half of the selection female, based on standardized test scores, their GPA, responses to essay questions, personal interviews, extracurricular activities, and recommendations. Instead of spending their junior and senior years in traditional high schools, students enroll in The Gatton Academy and live in a uniquely dedicated Gatton Academy residence hall. Taking courses offered by WKU, their classmates are fellow Gatton Academy students and WKU undergraduate students. At the end of two years, Gatton Academy students will have earned between sixty and seventy-two college credit hours in addition to completing high school.

Rogers Scholars (Abigail Bailey and Abigail Fathergill)

The Center for Rural Development's flagship youth program—provides leadership and college scholarship opportunities to help upcoming high school juniors in Southern and Eastern Kentucky develop the skills they need to seize their potential as the region's next generation of business and entrepreneurial leaders.
