Support to Students/Families (the following were provided to students):

75 items of clothing and 8 pair of shoes were distributed from the FRC clothing closet, due to students needing to change clothing

99 unduplicated students received PowerPacks during April, and 117 unduplicated students during the school year

Molly intervened with 18 contacts regarding students (since the last report) and attendance

6 students were referred to the Care Closet (since last report), to shop for clothing with volunteer, Miss Nancy

Care Closet diapers to 32 infants connected to NPS in May
