Affordability of Postsecondary Education-Work Group #1

Proposed Outcomes:

- Recommendation: A more focused, universal approach to education and support surrounding affordability.
- Strategic Plan: Create a seven-year support plan to help students from senior year of high school until one year post college graduate to guide and support them from the financial aid application through beginning loan repayment.

Postsecondary Advising- Work Group #2

- <u>Recommendation</u>: Leveraging and elevating college and career advising through KAA's resources and supports (advising toolkit, postsecondary advising framework, webinars, digital learning library, etc.)
