I. Call to Order

Chair Sharon Robinson welcomed all board members and guests to the meeting. The meeting was called to order at 9:00 A.M. ET.

The committee heard from the Kentucky United We Learn Vice Chair Jim Flynn, Ed.D. and KDE Chief Performance Officer Karen Dodd with an update about the work on the Council. There were no action items from the committee.

B. Report of the State Schools Committee on Action/Discussion Items

Committee Chair Randy Poe provided an update on the committee's meeting. The committee heard two presentations. KDE Associate Commissioner Beth Hargis, Ed.D. and KDE Division Director Beth Engle gave the Kentucky Tech Year in Review presentation. KDE Associate Commissioner Gretta Hylton ajdnKDE Division Director Shannon Sparkman presented on the CEASD Accreditation. There were no action items from the committee.

C. Local Board Member In-Service Training

Following a discussion with the full Board, Chair Robinson called for a motion. The motion was made by Steve Trimble and seconded by Diane Woods. The motion was approved unanimously with a voice vote. The Board also commended the team for their work on these regulations.

F. Amendment to 702 KAR 3:320, Finance Officer Certification Requirements

KDE Associate Commissioner Matt Ross and KDE Division Director Chay Ritter presented the proposed amendment to 702 KAR 3:320 regarding the requirements for Finance Officer certification. Following a discussion with the full Board, Chair Robinson called for a motion. The motion was made by Randy Poe and seconded by Holly Bloodworth. Vice Chair Lu Young abstained to avoid any conflict with her work outside the board. The motion was approved unanimously with a voice vote.

G. Waiver Request from the Ludlow Independent Board of Education Related to Section 4(4) of 702 KAR 4:050, Building sites; inspection, approval

KDE Associate Commissioner Matt Ross and KDE Division Director Chat Ritter presented the Ludlow Independent Board of Education's waiver request concerning 702 KAR 4:050. Following a discussion with the fill Board, Chair Robinson called for a motion. The motion was made by Steve Trimble and seconded by Randy Poe. The motion was approved unanimously with a voice vote.

XII. Presentation of the 2024 Karem Award for Excellence in Education Policy

Interim Commissioner Kinney and Chair Robinson presented the 2024 Karen Award for Excellence in Education Policy to Dr. Deanese Jameson. She received this award for policy development by assuming roles designed to help increase educational opportunities for students, such as serving as a delegate for the Warren Education Association and the Kentucky Education Association (KEA). She is a member of the KEA Constitutional Compliance Committee and one of two KEA representatives at Greenwood.

XIII. Presentation of the Teresa Perry Compassion Award

Interim Commissioner Kinney and KDE Communications Director Jennifer Ginn presented the 2024 Teresa Perry Compassion Award to Crystal Sohl. She received this award for her exceptional service at the Kentucky School for the Blind.
