HISTORY/BACKGROUND:

The FFVP is a federally assisted program providing free fresh fruits and vegetables to children at eligible elementary schools during the school day. The goal of the FFVP is to introduce children to fresh fruits and vegetables, to include new and different varieties, and to increase overall acceptance and consumption of fresh, unprocessed produce among children. The FFVP also encourages healthier school environments by promoting nutrition education. Beechgrove Elementary was awarded \$50,400.00.

Addendum to State Agency – School Food Authority Agreement Fresh Fruit and Vegetable Program

This agreement is between the Division of School and Community Nutrition (State Agency) and Kenton County School District (School Food Authority (SFA).

The undersigned has the authority to enter this Agreement to participate in the Fresh Fruit and Vegetable Program (Program) (FFVP) as authorized by Section 4304 of Public Law 110-234, the Food, Conservation, and Energy Act of 2008.

A. It is mutually agreed between the State Agency and School Food Authority that:

- 1. The School Food Authority agrees that the funds will only be used for the purposes authorized by Section 4304 of the Food, Conservation, and Energy Act of 2008, (Public Law 110-234).
- 2. The School Food Authority agrees to abide by all of the requirements for administering the Program as stated in Section 4304 of the Food, Conservation, and Energy Act of 2008 (Public Law 110-234).
- 3. The School Food Authority agrees to provide funds to the School Food Authority's approved FFVP sites under its jurisdiction for the service of approved fresh fruits and vegetables in accordance with local, State, and Federal regulations and requirements.
