#### Officer Demographics


BLACK Males: 21 WHITE Males: 28

- There were 4 former JCPS officers who were grandfathered into the new JCPS Police Department
- We have 7 new officers
- 8 officers were active at other agencies
- 35 officers were retired from other agencies (This includes 10 of the commanding officers)
- 17 former commanding officers
- Officers come from multiple agencies such as: LMPD, J-Town, Metro Corrections, Anchorage, Mt. Washington, and Bullitt County Sheriff's Office
- Officers ages range from 24-68 years of age
- Officers have thousands of years of law enforcement experience
- A number of officers have degrees

#### Organizational Chart








#### Officer Coverage & Geographical Assignments

- Officers are assigned in geographical areas
- Every high school and middle school will have an SSO assigned to support the staff by responding if requested
- Each officer has a primary high school or middle school with designated elementary schools in that geographical area
- Officers support school staff at all weapons detection systems in an observatory role.
- Twenty-nine high schools presently have WDS.
   Overall, there are 30 high schools and 23 middle schools slated to have weapons detection systems.

#### District Operation Center (DOC)

- New Civilian Supervisor: Sherrie Masden
- Fully staffed with 8 dispatchers
- The DOC is staffed 24/7 365 days

#### 2023-2024 **Graduation Security**

For the first time in JCPS history, all Graduation Ceremonies were covered by the JCPS Police Department.

- Officers supported
  - **26 High School Graduations**
  - 9 Middle School Graduation
  - **3 Elementary School Graduation**

High School Graduations were conducted over a 5 day period in conjunction with Middle and Elementary Graduations which occurred over a 7 day period.
