#### Learning at Lincoln!

- Our reading series, *Amplify CKLA* is in its third year of implementation. Teachers have all needed hard copy materials and access to their online materials. Our dedicated teachers received another important literacy training with our TRL Coach, Stefany from *The Reading League* on Wednesday, August 7<sup>th</sup>. The intentional, virtual coaching gifted to us from TRL will also continue this school year. We have been awarded this coaching for a fourth year.
- o We are in our fourth full year of implementation of our math series, EnVisions Math.
- All students will be embarking on an intentional Social Emotional Learning journey this school year at Lincoln. Our students in K-2 will be using *Mind Up* and grades 2 – 6 will be following the *Positive Action* curriculum.

#### **Emergency Plan/Drills**

- Every LES Staff member participated in a safety training with Officer Brendel and Ron Kinmon prior to the first day of school. During the training we reviewed all safety and drill procedures.
- All state required emergency drills have been completed with our students (severe weather, lockdown, earthquake, fire, etc.)

## 21st Century After-School Learning Program

 Our After-school program is up and running already this school year. They began the fourth day of school and is serving approximately 60 students at this time. They have the capacity to serve 100 of our Lincoln students grades K – 5.
