



# Understanding AMENDMENT 2

In addition to candidates for public office, voters will see two constitutional amendment questions on their ballots, the second of which deals with educational funding. There will be “yes” and “no” options from which to choose.

‘The General Assembly may provide financial support for the education of students outside the system of common schools. The General Assembly may exercise this authority by law, Sections 59, 60, 171, 183, 184, 186, and 189 of this Constitution notwithstanding.”
