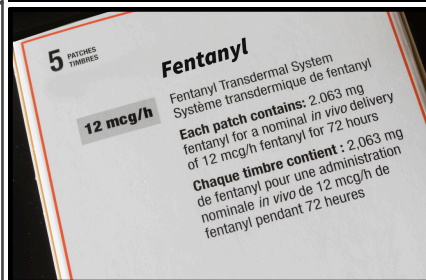
The Truth About Vaping - (4th-12th)
