Purpose: Provide academic, artistic, and cultural enrichment opportunities for students attending high-poverty and low-performing schools. Programs must provide a balance of enrichment opportunities that include active, hands-on engagement, with activities that address the needs of the whole child and help meet local and state academic standards. Including:

- ➤ Homework assistance daily
- > Evidence-based activities designed to reinforce and complement the regular academic program
- Active and meaningful family engagement and adult skill-building activities

Eligibility: Schools must have a 40% free-reduced lunch rate based on the December 2023 rate.

Program Goals:

- 1. Increase academic achievement of participating students in math, reading, and science and daily K-3 reading interventions.
- 2. Improve non-cognitive indicators of success in participating students.
- 3. Meet or increase the proposed number of students who will attend the program for 90 hours or more during the academic year.
- 4. Increase access to transition readiness activities for all students.
- 5. Increase literacy and other educational opportunities, that are meaningful and intentional, to support parents and working families.

Other Considerations:

- ➤ Must provide a full-time Site Coordinator for the program;
- **Co-applicant** partner providing services and/or resources is <u>required</u>;
- Four additional community partners are <u>required</u>;
- ➤ K-3 reading intervention <u>required</u> for elementary schools;

- School-year afterschool program: 8 hours per week <u>minimum</u> after school, with services at least four days per week, Monday through Thursday;
- > OPTIONAL morning activities in addition to two hours after school daily;
- ➤ <u>Summer programming</u> required annually (Elementary 120 hours minimum over 4 consecutive weeks; Middle/High 40 hours minimum over two consecutive weeks);
- > 50% of hours are for academic assistance and 50% are for enrichment <u>in addition</u> to homework help;
- > Serve a minimum of 50 students for 90 hours or more during the school year;
- Employ a minimum of two certified teachers for 8 hours per week each;
- > Staff to student ratio is 15:1;
- > Transportation cannot be a barrier to participation and a transportation plan must be included;
- Use the USDA program to provide snacks (school year) and meals (summer);
- Four skill-building family engagement activities (two in the fall and two in the spring) annually;
- > Private and home school students are eligible to participate and private/home schools must be consulted during the application process;
- Funding decreases in Years 4 and 5.

Competitive Priorities:

- ➤ Continuation Grants Up to 10 points
- ➤ Comprehensive Support and Improvement (CSI) Schools Up to 10 points
- \triangleright New schools 5 points
- ➤ Programs serving 50 regular attendees for <u>90 hours</u> or more 5 points
- ➤ Transportation offered daily 3 points
