Positive Developments and Highlights

Regular season has completed without too much disruption or incident

Issues of Concern (legal, playing Rules, fiscal management, etc.) Many questions throughout the year regarding Guardian Cap. Even have had suggestion that they be "required" equipment. The literature and reviews are mixed as we have presented to you earlier. Various studies argue about the efficacy of the devices and there is much concern about them leading to a feeling of invincibility and having athletes take extra risk. They are permitted by playing rules.

The NFHS Rules Committee meets in February with technology and technological advances expected to be a big topic of discussion.

The state championship games will be held at Kroger Fleld in Lexington, as part of a rolling extendable four-year commitment from the University for a variety of facilities.

We are into round 2 as of this meeting, with Round 3 being the round of re-bracketing.

Participation is extremely strong statewide, although there are metropolitan areas where participation has not rebounded completely from the pandemic adjustments. It is passed along by various coaches that the reduction in squads and seasons at the younger level is still impacting high school participation as these students get older. Participation numbers are attached. The first round games had a slightly less average margin of victory than 2023, but the margin of around +-30 points remain consistent. See the chart attached. There will always be discussion about this round with the "old guard" saying that you should bring less teams, others reminding people that all teams advance of postseason in all other sports, and a third group decrying any system that would give a team a bye due to not playing for a couple of weeks.

This last point is the continued reason to look at withdrawal timelines and parameters that impact teams and hosts which will be a part of this agenda topic.

## Officials Update/Review

For the second year, first round playoff games were restricted to five officials unless teams were willing to play on another night. The assigners around the state did a fantastic job with relatively short notice in getting all Friday night games staffed with five officials for the first round. This was problematic in a few 2 vs. 3 seed games that really needed the appropriate coverage of 7 officials, but in the end, is a workable middle ground. The game is quite simply better managed and officiated with 7 officials from

a variety of perspectives. All games rounds 2 through 5 will have 7 officials as they have for several years.

The schools for the most part did a great job basically stepping back and allowing the staff to manage the playoffs from a data perspective. Almost all schools submitted the FB106 schedule form in a timely manner which let staff keep a good look at changes for both the teams, sites, officials and brackets. Every single game time impacts about five different data points, and the school cooperation is essential. As he assigners continue to adapt to the changes with the adoption of the KHSAA360/ArbiterSports data management system, operations will continue to smooth out for all.

Lastly, football officials throughout the state were very appreciative of the revisions in the pay schedule that were approved by the Board, particularly in postseason. The postseason games do not represent budgeted receipts or expenses for most schools and the early indicators are that this change did not impact the games in a negative financial way.

## Staff and Worker Update

Workers have been contacted for the football finals and most positions are filled. The initial organizational meeting for the playoffs was held this week and the University staff is ready to host again. Most preparations on their end will finalize after their last home football game on Thanksgiving weekend.
