Takeaways to help Board and Staff

A very positive and beneficial training experience. Not only for the KHSAA Member High School Administrators that attended, but for KHSAA and Arbiter Staff as well.

On Tuesday, October 15, and Wednesday, October 16, the KHSAA and Arbiter held two joint in-person training meetings for KHSAA Member School Administrators. The meetings were held at the Knicely Center in Bowling Green and Central Bank Center in Lexington.

There were 43 in attendance at Bowling Green and 83 in Lexington.

Commissioner Tackett and I were presenters from the KHSAA. In attendance from ArbiterSports were Zane Zientek (Product Manager), Ashlee Lavatai (Enterprise Specialist and Kentucky's State Support Contact), and Kate Fuchs (Solutions Product Manager). To assist Ms. Fuchs at both meetings, Athletic Director Casey Fisk from Scott High School presented and demonstrated Arbiter Registration - an additional option in the ArbiterSports platform that more KHSAA member schools are adopting.
