Our school has a current enrollment of 463 students in preschool through fifth grade. The student population is 87% Caucasian and has a free/reduced lunch rate of over 55%. Because many of students live in rural areas, they do not have access to venues such as libraries, parks, and museums. The school is one place where the families can gather and spend time learning with their children.
