Inspection will be held during lineup for takeoff. Live wells must be empty.

Anglers are required to have a valid Kentucky fishing license/ permit, if applicable by law.

Fish Limits

Spotted bass 12", largemouth 15", smallmouth 18"

Anglers are allowed to weigh a limit of five (5) fish per team unless otherwise required by law or tournament officials.

Fish presented which fails to measure the official length limits shall accrue penalties at the rate of one (1) pound for each non-legal fish plus loss of the fish. An 8-ounce deduction will be made for each fish presented that is determined to be non-releasable.
