

Enrollment on February 21, 2025 was 1353. This was the 108th day of instruction for the 2024-2025 school year.

Support Education Excellence in Kentucky (SEEK) is the foundation program for legislative funding of public education and provides a per pupil amount of funding based on the average daily membership in conjunction with average daily attendance in grades K- 12. Virtual and performance based attendance funding is derived from the percentage of scheduled courses with passing grades each semester.

School districts do not receive SEEK funding for Preschool. Preschool enrollment is funded through a state grant. As of 02/21/2025 there are 70 students enrolled in Preschool.

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Newport Regional School, located at Campbell County Juvenile Detention Center generates funds during the time span of enrollment.

School districts do not receive SEEK funds nor SEEK At Risk funding for students enrolled at Regional School Programs. There are nine students enrolled in this type of program.

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Truancy

Truancy is defined by statute as any student who has attained the age of six (6), but has not reached his/her eighteenth (18th) birthday, who has been absent from school without valid excuse for three (3) days or more, or tardy without valid excuse on three (3) days or more. Any student who has been reported as a truant two (2) or more times is a habitual truant.

Educational Neglect is also defined by statute: Does not provide the child with adequate care, supervision, food, clothing, shelter, and education or medical care necessary for the child’s well-being when financially able to do so or offered financial or other means to do so.

Title I

Newport Independent requested via Disclosure of Free and Reduced Price Information an account of students attending school through the Diocese of Covington. We have seven private schools represented for potential participation. Low-income private school children living in our district generate funds for services. The children who generate funds for the private school may not be the same students who receive Title I services. To be eligible to receive Title I, Part A services, a child must reside within the attendance area of a participating public school and be failing or at risk of failing academic achievement standards as identified through multiple educationally related criteria. These determinations are made between Newport Independent and representatives of each participating private school through review of data.

Letters to non-public schools will be mailed on March 3, 2025 as agreed to across Northern Ky schools. Those schools intending to participate must return their intent with a post mark date of March 17, 2025. It is the responsibility of the public school to contact officials from every

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private and home school serving students in our school attendance area and those located outside of our borders who have Newport resident students enrolled.

Hold Harmless

Hold Harmless and funding projections were provided to school principals and superintendent on January 23, 2025.

Background Information

- States/districts have not received an allocation for FY 26. Hold Harmless percentages are used to estimate Title I, Part A funding. Please keep in mind that all numbers are tentative and are subject to change.
- The U.S. Department of Education bases Title I, Part A allocations on estimates of the number and percentage of formula children in each district (as provided by the U.S. Census Bureau), along with updated state per-pupil expenditure data. Formula children are defined below:
 - Children ages 5-17 residing in the geographic boundaries of the school district from families below the poverty level identified from census data compiled by the U.S. Department of Commerce. Census poverty children comprise the greatest portion of formula children. The U.S. Department of Education uses updated Census estimates to calculate Title I allocations.
 - Children ages 5-17 in licensed facilities for foster children updated annually by the Kentucky Cabinet for Families and Children and reported to the U.S. Secretary of Health and Human Services. This is the number of children living in foster care for at least 30 consecutive days, at least one day of which was in the month of October.
 - Children ages 5-17 in local institutions for neglected children reported annually by the Kentucky Department of Education to the U.S. Department of Education. This is the number of children who resided in an institution for neglected children for at least 30 consecutive days, at least one day of which was in the month of October.

Hold Harmless Provisions

- Title I, Part A has a variable hold-harmless guarantee, which sets the minimum allocation for each district, as long as the district is eligible to receive funds from the same Part A funding sources as in the previous year and sufficient funds are appropriated by the U.S. Congress.
- Estimates for a minimum allocation are calculated by multiplying hold harmless rate by the current year's final allocation.

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FY 25 December 30, 2024 published Title I, Part A allocation amount: \$1,186,454.00

Initial Projection of Reduction for FY 26 = \$247,103.00

Title IV is NOT included in the allocation totals as a rolled item. FY 25 Title IV allocation- \$94,282.00

Funding available to schools is dependent on the total district set aside, per pupil amount, participation of private schools, and number of private school students who generate funds for their private school. We will not have a final number of participants or grade range of Private School students until mid-March.

Initial Title I, Part A School Allocation

- For Budgeting purposes use of the FY 25 Private School Proportionate Share of Allocation was increased to 33,000.00 This number may increase or decrease based on current student enrollment at those schools declaring participation.
