Franklin-Simpson High School has participated in this program for four years and we have three young males who are currently enrolled in this program. As part of the program, the young men compete at the state Educators Rising Competition which is held in Louisville, KY and at the National Educators Rising Competition which is being held in Orlando, FL this summer. The students from FSHS are competing in the categories of Public Speaking and Job Interviewing. The Public Speaking Competition is designed to highlight students who demonstrate the qualities of self-composure, confidence, and the ability to clearly articulate information by combining thoughtful preparation and confident delivery into an interesting presentation on a current education topic. The Job Interview Competition is an opportunity for Educators Rising members to develop and practice their interview.

skills, as well as cover letter and résumé writing skills. In this competition, entrants apply for a position as a paraprofessional (a link to the position description can be found below). This includes submitting a cover letter explaining why the entrant is a good candidate for the position, as well as a résumé that details relevant work, volunteer work, and educational experiences. Last year, the cost to attend state and national competition for the 23 boys in the program was around \$30,000. The Dean of the College of Education at WKU, Dr. Murphy contributes to the cost of funding this initiative as well as each school/district. Mr. Schlosser has been supportive of the program for the FSHS boys to participate over the last few years. Specifically, monies suppoled will help to pay for registration, transportation, and food for Louisville, KY and Orlando, FL. The state competition is March 5th and the national competition is June 26th 30th.
