






Q2: Which JCPS school district do you live in:



Q3: What role group best describes you (select all that apply)




Q4: To which ethnic group do you most identify?








Q8: How important is the candidate's ability to lead a team?



Q9: How important is the candidate's ability to implement policies to achieve staff diversity?




Q10: How important is the candidate's ability to recruit and retain staff?






Q11: How important is the candidate's ability to implement policies to meet the needs of students in the Choice Zone, multilingual learners, and students with special needs?







Q12: How important is the candidate's ability to close the opportunity, achievement, and resources gap?




Q13: How important is the candidate's ability to champion services to address the mental health concerns of students and staff?




Q14: How important is it that the candidate has experience focusing on student behavior in the classroom?




Q15: How important is the candidate's ability to enhance relationships outside JCPS, for instance, with elected state and local leadership, business partners, and community groups?




Q16: How important is the candidate's ability to build and implement a plan to improve JCPS facilities?

Supplemental Analysis

At the March 11 meeting, the JCPS Superintendent Search Advisory Committee requested a further analysis disaggregating the results by various role groups. The following tables present the distribution of responses by role group, race/ethnicity, board district, and zip code for the question:

"Which do you believe is the single most important qualification for the ideal Superintendent?"

Overall, most groups selected the same top two qualifications. The highestrated qualification was **promoting the academic achievement of all students across the district**, followed by **focusing on student behavior in the classroom**.

However, there was some variability in responses among the second-choice selections for some respondent groups.




