District Guidance for Professional Development and Learning:

To provide additional professional learning throughout the year, we've created some guidelines to help you navigate. These guidelines will be used to determine professional development credit, EILA credit, and when a staff member may or may not receive a stipend for professional learning.

As of right now, the district will be offering the following professional development for the 2025-2026 school year: *(As we move forward, we will notify you of any changes)*

CIPS PD Academy-

Up to 12 hours of PD available on August 13 and 14, 2025-

Professional development will be offered at our 4th Annual Covington PD Academy on August 13 and 14 for any staff who choose to attend or are assigned by the principal. We use your PD survey information to provide professional learning choices for you to individualize your learning plan. The PD Academy is not a requirement from the district but can be by your supervisor. If staff members choose to attend sessions that put them above their 24 hours, they need to have principal permission stated on their PD plan. Those stipends must be paid at the school level, or it will be counted as unpaid professional learning. *(Sessions will be shared once planning is complete.)*

The district in all departments will provide stipends for all NEW teacher training.

If staff **choose** to attend additional professional development beyond their 24 hours, it will be counted as unpaid professional learning. Principals can decide to pay a stipend for this professional learning if they wish from their school funds. If principals **assign staff** to professional learning above their 24 hours, they should plan to offer stipends to teachers from school funds.

What is required of schools?

- School submits school professional development plan to the district for review (due March 28)

- Each school's SBDM Council shall approve school PD plans (approval by SBDM can occur after the due date above- the school can then submit any revisions made by SBDM if needed)
- The District PD Plan shall be approved by the Board of Education, and the School PD Plan shall be submitted to the Board of Education for review and comment.
- Individual PD plans for each staff member are required to earn PD, all plans must be approved by the principal or supervisor

Conference attendance considerations and guidance for both certified and classified staff:

- The professional development opportunity (conference) shall be related to the CDIP/CSIP
- **Staff being offered the opportunity to attend a conference by anyone other than their principal or supervisor must communicate with the principal or supervisor regarding conference attendance, PD credit, or stipend approval before registering for a conference.**
- If CIPS requires attendance at a conference or training so that a staff member will be qualified to offer a particular class for students or training for staff, this staff member could receive either PD or a stipend. *(Examples: School Crisis Management Instructor- Training of the SCM Instructor is mandatory for the SCM Instructor to be able to train crisis management teams in our schools, or in some cases, a Career and Technical Education teacher may need training to be qualified to teach a class in which students receive industry certification.)*
- Is this a leadership opportunity only? This means the staff member chooses to attend for professional learning reasons and will not receive PD or a stipend. **It is the principal's responsibility to communicate this clearly to staff before they register for a conference/training.**
- Each school year, staff can be given up to 6 hours of PD for a conference with prior approval from their principal and District PD Coordinator. *(the third bullet above is the exception)*
- It is the responsibility of the party planning and registering individuals for a conference to secure funding before the registration process
- Follow-up after these opportunities must be planned before the registration process. *(Example- If a staff member or group of individuals attend a conference, how will this learning be shared with other staff members?)*

The current District PD Plan and School PD Plans must be posted to individual websites each year.
