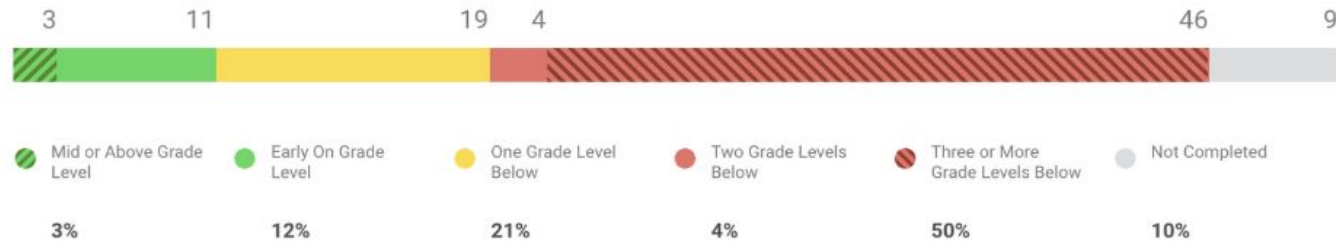

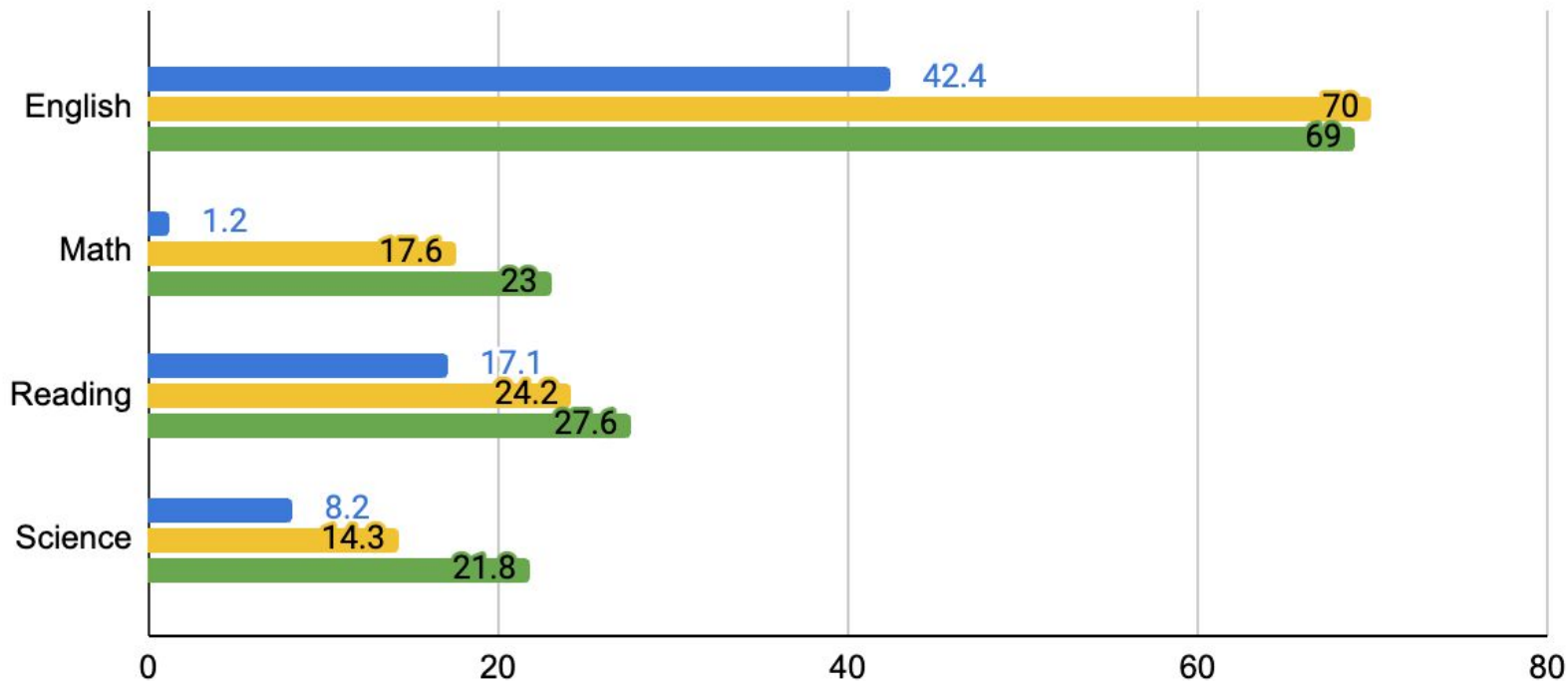

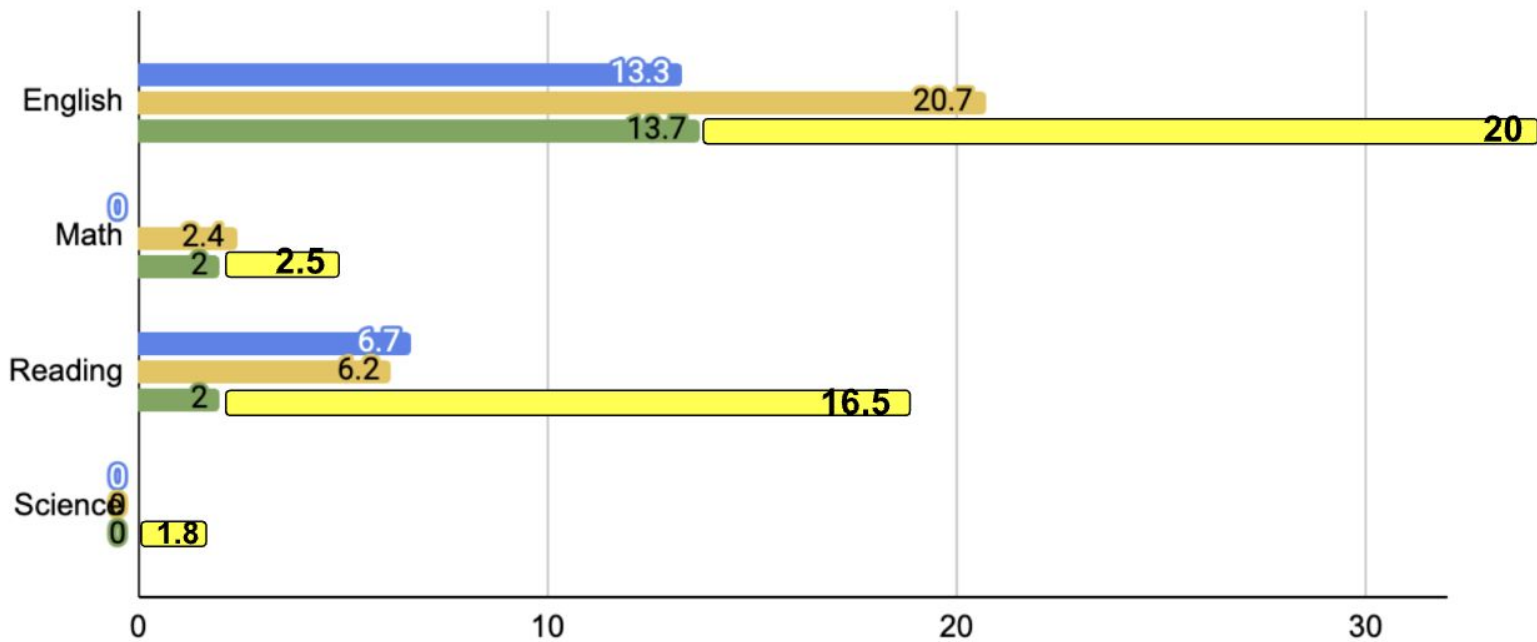

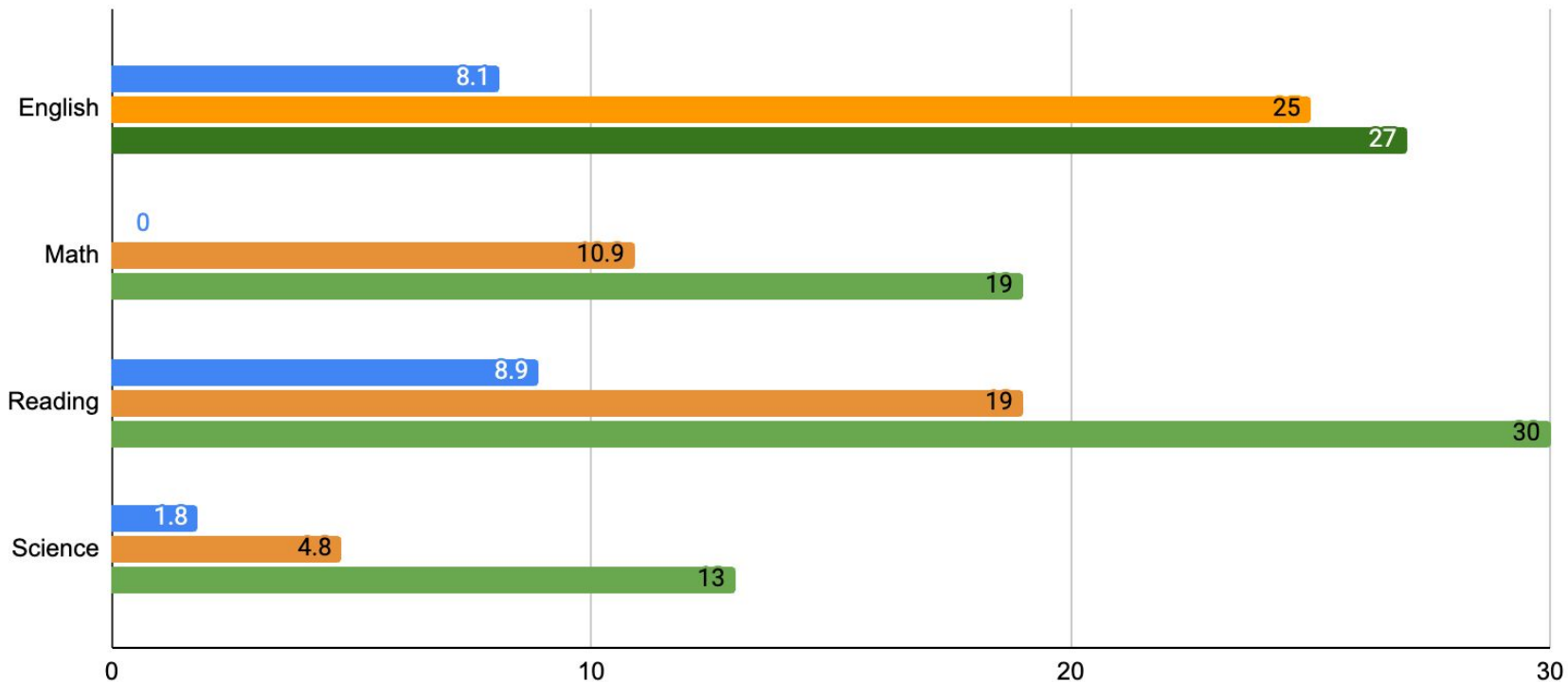
Fall Winter Spring ACT

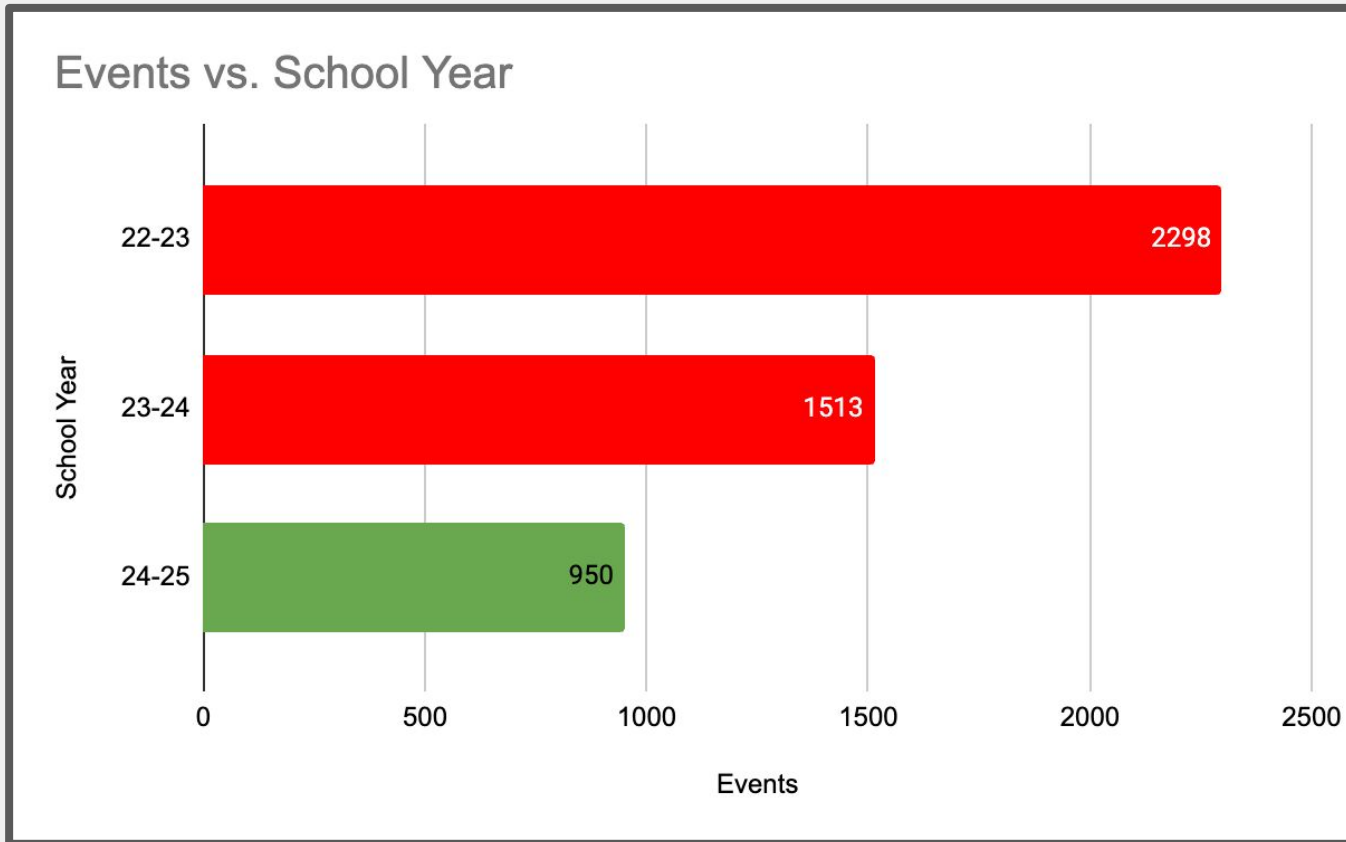

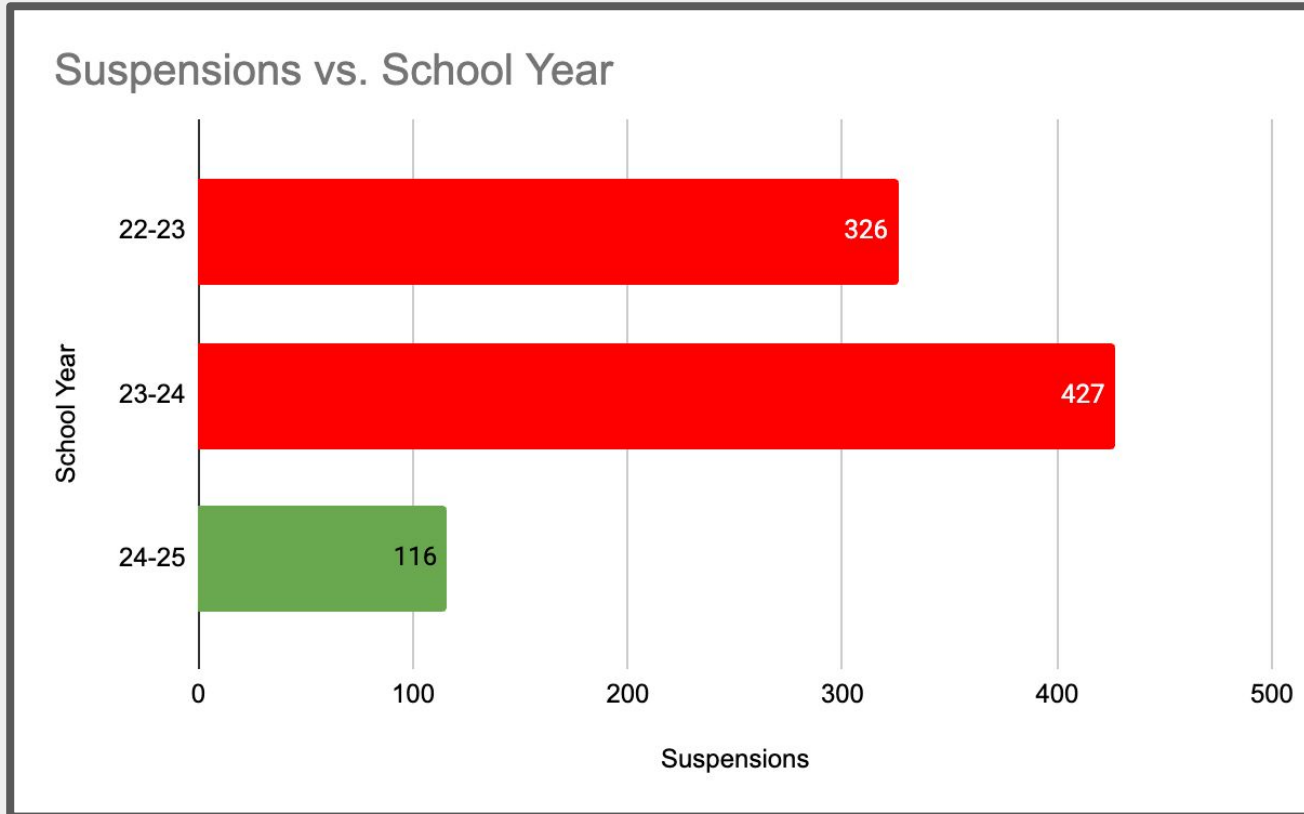

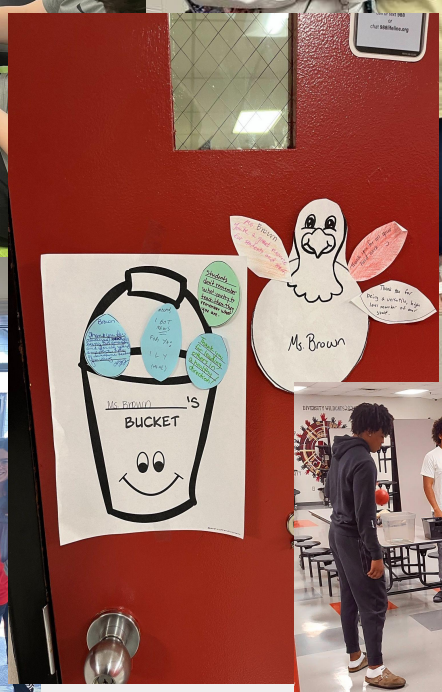

How will NHS move forward?

Use KAS to ensure high-quality Tier I instruction

Place a bigger emphasis on Tier I instruction

Continue to use the data from I-Ready to monitor the growth of students

Continue to use the data from I-Ready to regroup students - Enrichment and Tier III Intervention

Continue to test three times a year in I-Ready/CERT to allow students to see their own growth or weaknesses.

Continue to identify students to place in Tier II groups while in the classroom, some pull outs if necessary

Continue to give efficient feedback to students to aid in improvements

How will NHS move forward?

Maintain 4 school counselors

- 3 school counselors and mental health counselor through a grant

Maintain 2 assistant principals

- 1 middle school; 1 high school

Maintain BIC teacher

- Works with students in grades 7-12

What is NHS doing right in CURRICULUM

- PLC meetings once a week with a focus on the data from End of Unit Assessments
- Use essential standards in math and reading to guide Tier I core instruction
- Restructure the master schedule to ensure all middle school students have access to intervention
- Develop interventions on each student's individual needs, and assign staff based on who is best trained to meet each need

Continued CURRICULUM

- Use a universal screener (I-Ready/CERT) three times a year to gather data
- Offer after school tutoring - ESS & 21st Century
- Update the Student-Athlete Expectations
- Add Reading Development back into the high school schedule for the 24-25 SY
- Recruit and hire teachers for the 24-25 SY

What is NHS doing right in SEL?

Cyber Bully Prevention Assembly (grades 7-8-9)

Suicide Prevention (Aug)

Suicide Awareness (Jan)

It's My Space (Green Dot Middle School Program) (1 week spent with 7th graders and 8th graders once a year)

Bystander Training - Green Dot - (meet with a selected group of students twice a year / fall and spring)

Green Dot - Freshman Modules (one day in English I class)

Bystander Booster Afterschool Meetings start (once a month for 30 minutes)

Green Dot also completes 2 surveys one in the fall and one in the spring.

Tobacco and Vaping Education with all students (with all students - MS/HS)
