

Airport Transportation

Chicago Midway International Airport (MDW) is approximately 30 minutes (12.5 miles), and Chicago O'Hare International Airport (ORD) is approximately 30 minutes (17 miles) from the Chicago Marriott Downtown Magnificent Mile, respectively.

TAXI SERVICE

Taxis are readily available at Chicago Midway International Airport (MDW) and Chicago O'Hare International Airport (ORD). Cab fare is approximately \$35-40 (MDW) and \$50 (ORD) one way. Taxi stands are located on the lower level curbfront of the terminals.
